A Word from Pastor Jon



The Easter Services were wonderful and well attended. It was an exciting week in our various Holy Week Services where we had five baptisms and received six new members into our churches. I'm excited about the worship services, discipleship opportunities and the direction our churches are heading. Already we are scheduling another New Members Class. This is a sign that

people are connecting and for that we are thankful. But at the same time we are ready to continue the work God has called to do.

Our challenge is to strengthen our internal and external focus in order for our churches to continue the growth and improvement we've experienced so far. Internally we will continue to work on worship, hospitality, and discipleship. This internal focus helps us to know God more and love God deeper which should naturally be expressed in how we live in relationship with others. We want to be internally strong as a foundation for our second major focus which is external.

We are going to focus on that and I can't wait to ask ourselves that question again a year from now!


