# A Word from Pastor Jon

I have a patch, not any patch. It's the mission patch of the Space Shuttle Challenger mission that ended in disaster. As many of you know I grew up around the space center in Florida. I remember like it was yesterday sitting in my friend's car as we watched the launch that beautiful clear day. Then in a moment disaster struck. I keep this



patch because it reminds me of who real heroes are. These astronauts and mission specialist understood very well the dangers they faced and any of them would have an element of fear about what they were doing. But, they move ahead in spite of the fear and dangers. **They press on**. **That's a hero**. Not some rock star, celebrity or a sports figure who happens to be popular today.

It's people like the challenger crew, police officers, and firefighters. It's also teachers, counselors, yes even pastors who in spite of the fears of danger or failure continue to press on.

As we all read various scriptures about the events of Holy Week and we read about the fear of the disciples, and we have sympathy. We read about Thomas's skepticism, and we become judgmental. But, what if, Thomas and the other Disciples are truly afraid, the Disciples fear the known that is they know what happened to Jesus and that perhaps it could happen to them. Thomas fears the unknown that is what he has not seen. Fear resides in all of us. We can be fearful of the known and unknown.

Fear comes from knowing the dangers and risks that are inherent in the event or task. It might be a new challenge, a job that you want to go after, or a change that you want to make in life. *Courage is acting in spite of those fears.* 

We are all being challenged to look at change in our lives and our church. Sometimes we may feel afraid but like so many before us let's lean on each other and our faith in God. You never know what may come to pass for those who have the courage to **press on**!



# **Bible Study**

# Book of James – Practical Christianity

Prairie Chapel Starts Sunday May 17 at 2:00 pm – 3:30 pm Alburnett Starts Monday May 18<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm – 8:00 pm



The purpose of this study is to present the practical message of James as found in his New Testament epistle and understand its implications for life today.

This study is a participatory study for students who want a challenging study. A variety of commentaries, Bible dictionaries, and reference materials will be made available for their use. This short term study will be

conducted over 4-5 weeks with each session lasting approximately 90 minutes.

Some of the objectives of this study are:

Present a basic overview of the book of James including background, themes, and unique characteristics.

Students will become familiar with the use of study tools such as a study Bible, study guides, Bible dictionary, and a Bible commentary.

Students will discuss the relationship between what we believe and how we behave based on the teaching of James.

Compare and contrast what the letter of James says about "faith and works" with what is said about "faith and works" in Paul's letters.

- Pennsylvania students are educating their community about sextrafficking at home and abroad




