A Word from Pastor Jon

Between the Now and the Not Yet.— Part 2

Last month I shared some thoughts about when we find ourselves in life situations where we are in transition from what we have known or where we are, to something new something different, but we are not there yet. We find ourselves in-between. We're between the now and not yet. When we are in places

like this sometimes, we don't know what to do. We may even feel like we have no control over the situation. That is just how those two disciples must have felt on the road from Jerusalem to Emmaus.

One additional point, whatever the circumstances that brought us to our Emmaus Road experience may seem beyond our control. But there is something that we do have control over, and that is whether we will walk the road alone or choose to walk it with others. Can we resist the temptation to keep things to ourselves or dare to be open and share our heart with another disciple that walks with us?

The disciples' choice to walk together and talk about all the things that had happened to them was rather radical. They could have decided to walk together and avoid talking about what was really going on.

But while the experiences of that first Good Friday weekend were still fresh and raw they choose to walk and talk about all these things that had happened. The crucial choice was to walk together and speak honestly about the issues of their (and our) lives and this action causes Jesus to come near.

The disciples on the Emmaus road were discussing the stuff of their lives, all the things that had happened, that were having such an impact on them spiritually and in every other way too. There was something about the nature and quality of their conversation that opened up space for Jesus to draw near.

This is a significant part of our Wesleyan theology which is to be in connection with one another, to watch over one another in love. We share life together and love each other through the challenges and joys of life. When challenges come our way as they will my prayer is our church will be the kind where we can lean on one another and know we are loved not judged. We can find peace, comfort, and grace when we open our hearts to each other. It is in these moments that God truly can break into our lives with God's transforming power.

What God has in store for us is unknown but, let's open our hearts to God and each other, then Jesus will draw near. The result is captured in the words of Paul in 1 Cor 2:9.

But, as it is written,

"What no eye has seen, nor ear heard,

nor the human heart conceived,

what God has prepared for those who love him".

The "Covenant Bible Study" will help us in our life together. Maybe this is an opportunity to learn more about our life together. Look for the article in this newsletter about the start of the Covenant Bible study.

- > stepping in when urgent needs arise. (The first priority of an usher is, after all, the safety of those who are worshiping.)


When you do this, you're joining with centuries of people who have loved God and have valued *the event* that takes place when God's people gather together in worship.


