





JANUARY MISSION PROJECT: In December, we started a crusade called "Homes for Haiti." Sukup Manufacturing in Sheffield, Iowa has designed these homes for "Go Serve Global" from their grain bin models. In 2013, our church purchased a home and the statistics are out. After the hurricane several months ago, the two villages of these homes survived; a few with only minimal damage. Up to 60 people crammed themselves into these homes for protection. Our church is putting out a challenge. We want to send two homes. They cost \$7,000 each. The first one has been bought with money from our general funds. The challenge is to match that with this crusade. So far we have collected \$4,040 for the second home. Watch for displays on the bulletin board and other areas around the church. Let's all join together to build another home for people in one the poorest nations. Let's see how God can use us.
