A WORD FROM PASTOR JON



October Sermon Series: The Enemies of Gratitude

We enter the month of October and it's hard to believe that its truly fall already. Our farmers are back into the fields as we enter harvest time. We offer prayers for their strength and safety as many will put in long hours of work. October is also a time of year where we begin to think about our blessings, and we are thankful, but there can be barriers to our sense of gratitude.

We will explore the things that keep us from being content and grateful. This sermon series also offers an opportunity to teach gratitude by calling out the things that keep us from being truly grateful. In each topic listed below, we see how a misplaced focus on how things could be or used to be better, how we're not getting what we think we deserve, or simply how life's struggles are keeping us down-prevents us from seeing all the blessings that are right in front of us. The Scripture selections for the month will move back and forth from the Old Testament to the New, the need for "an attitude of gratitude" is made clear in each of our texts.

Here are the topics that we will look at in October:

•October 1, 2017 Exodus 17:1-17 The Enemies of Gratitude: **Nostalgia**

Glorifying the past blinds us to present blessings

•October 8, 2017 Philippians 4:1-9 The Enemies of Gratitude: **Worry**

It's not about less stress, but more trust.

•October 15, 2017 Matthew 22:15-22

The Enemies of Gratitude: Greed

Give to God what is God's (i.e., everything).

•October 22, 2017 Matthew 22:1-14 The Enemies of Gratitude: **Entitlement**

None of us "deserves" the invitation, but we share it anyway.

•October 29, 2017 Deut. 34:1-12

The Enemies of Gratitude: **Disappointment**

Don't let loss keep you from appreciating the good.

I look forward to seeing you as we enter this month's emphasis.

2017 Annual Conference Report

Pastor Jon and I attended the 174th Iowa Annual Conference in Des Moines, June 10-12, 2017. The conference in general was enjoyable, with the usual inspirational messages, music, ordination and retirement ceremonies. We have a new Mission, Vision and Wildly Important Goal.

Our new Bishop Laurie Haller came to Iowa a year ago, but her husband stayed behind in Michigan to finish his final ministry year. She regaled us with the chaos of closing up the old house and moving in the midst of last-minute Conference preparations.

When I last attended Conference in 2014, the treasurer said the budget would decline slightly each future year, in line with shrinking church membership, attendance and giving. The 2018 budget is \$14.6 million, up 4.4% from 2017. Evidently previous year cuts were too deep, as actual expenses exceeded the budget in several areas such as health care. A motion for more transparency on salaries, benefits and travel was ruled out of order. Various adjustments were proposed, but at on the final day the original budget was approved with no changes.

I was distressed by the adoption of many politically progressive action items that seem unrelated to the purpose of the church. #301 asks the Conference to urge the USDA to tighten soil erosion regulations. Speakers pointed out that already hard-pressed family farms will be impacted, and that the soil loss statistics quoted in the motion are decades old and don't reflect modern conservation practices. But everyone is pro-environment so the resolution passed.

#318 calls on the President and Congress to ratify the Treaty to Ban Land Mines. A speaker pointed out that the resolution is moot because treaty has been closed to new signatories since the 1990s. But everyone opposes land mines so the resolution passed.

Similarly, resolutions on Climate Change, Energy Conservation, to oppose Oil Spills, to support the DREAM Act, to affirm LGBTQ persons, Federal Budget Priorities (reduce military expenses in favor of health and education spending), and Jubilee Network to cancel international debts passed. Speakers pointed out the Church has more important priorities than wasting time on political activism. #319 directing churches and parsonages to test for Radon passed, even though that's already required.

The most contentious resolution was #320 to not deny church membership (or more importantly, church leadership including ministry) because of "race, color, national origin, economic condition, gender identity, marital status, sexual orientation, ability or disability, or any other status. After a long discussion (an hour past the scheduled finish) with the parliamentarian, the Bishop ruled it out of order because the list of protected classes exceeds the Book of Discipline. However, the Executive Committee of the Iowa Conference Board of Ordained Ministry has ruled that "sexual orientation or gender identity" will not be criteria to "deny any candidate's ability to live up to our United Methodist standards for fitness for ministry".

We voted on several resolutions to amend the Discipline, but results but will not be available until the 2020 General Conference.

Conference dates in Des Moines were announced thru 2019. Motions to consider moving it back to Ames "as God intended" in future years seemed to fall on deaf ears.

Anyone who would like more details can read the Pre Conference Manual and daily reports online, and view live-stream recordings of the sessions.

Pastor Jon and I attended a dinner for the "REVIVE / Wesleyan Covenant Association" (WCA), a joining of three (and two earlier) church renewal organizations. We voted to elect a slate of officers including Mike Morgan of Marion UMC. They are concerned about deep divisions in the United Methodist Church, which they see straying from Scripture and defying the Discipline with no consequences.

Significant changes are coming which could split the denomination and affect local churches. WCA is working and praying for an orderly process of growth and renewal. A schism will certainly harm our denomination's mission, but the current reality is also harming our confidence in a unified denomination. Pastor Jon is preparing a presentation for our parish about the current conflict within the denomination and is assured that there will be viable options for our parish should they be necessary. We will be well informed and stay true to our call to ministry here in the area and our mission to the world as disciples of Jesus Christ.


