A Word from Pastor Jon



Last month I shared with you that there will be an opportunity for our congregations to hear an update on the status of the issues our denomination is facing and how that may impact us. I attended a meeting with Bishop Laurie Haller on April 7th where she facilitated conversation around the "Commission on a Way Forward," which was proposed by the Council of Bishops and approved by the 2016 General Conference to

do a complete examination and possible revision of every paragraph of the Book of Discipline concerning human sexuality, and explore options that help to maintain and strengthen the unity of the church.

This is a good time for our congregation to meet and hear where the Commission is at in their work and how that may affect us. There is a special Called General Conference scheduled in 2019 where the United Methodist Church will hear the recommendations from the Commission as presented to the Council of Bishops.

I will be making a presentation to our churches on 1) the current status of the denomination, and 2) how we got to this point, and 3) How might this impact us?

Church Meetings will be as follows:

Prairie Chapel will meet on Wednesday, May 16 at 7:00PM.

Alburnett will meet on Wednesday, May 23 at 7:00PM.

This is the only time in my five years as your pastor that I have called for the church to come together for a special meeting like this, so I am asking that you make every effort to attend.

In the mean time, you can join me in prayer for our denomination, its leaders, and the Commission as they work through this very difficult process. I have joined other local Pastors in praying every day that the United Methodist Church will arise a stronger church and that the Holy Spirit will bring life into our Church. We have a very rich Wesleyan heritage that continues to be relevant for the day in which we live.

MISSIONS SPEAKER MAY 12

ON SUNDAY, MAY 12 WE WILL HAVE A GUEST SPEAKER DURING THE WORSHIP SERVICE: Mission Starfish Haiti was started by Silentor Thomas Esthil-Henderson. Silentor was born and raised in Lacroix, Haiti, 10 miles outside of Gonaives and grew up there for the first nine years of his life. It was when Silentor became very ill with a bone infection and unable to walk that his mother took him to a clinic to receive medical attention. In order to save Silentor's life he needed several surgeries and specialized care. A nurse, Tommy Henderson, who was working at the clinic offered to take Silentor back to the United States in order for him to get the care he needed. After several years and 30 operations, Silentor was able to walk again. Since Silentor had attended American schools while he was getting his medical treatment, he decided to stay and finish his education. Tommy eventually adopted Silentor and provided him a permanent home in the United States.

Silentor graduated from Bettendorf High School in 2006 and went on to attend and graduate from Iowa State University. After graduating college in 2010, Silentor joined "Teach for America" and taught 7th and 8th grade history in a high poverty community located in Miami.

Silentor had the privilege to access and benefit from a quality educational system. His vision is to bring quality education to his home country and community and to those children who otherwise would not have access to education. Silentor knew Haitian children led a "wandering" life with little structure, leadership and direction and very little education. Silentor saw the opportunity to change this way of life for Haitian children by creating Mission Starfish Haiti to provide children a high quality Christian education. Silentor now resides in Haiti, living in the community he serves, managing the ministry, conducting teacher training, hosting volunteer groups and fundraising for the Mission Starfish Haiti.

On October 1st, 2012 Mission Starfish Haiti opened its doors to 172 students. When MSH opened, it provided education to children from kindergarten to third grade. Each year since, MSH has added a grade level in order for those students to continue their education and hopes to add a grade level each year until the school can offer kindergarten through ninth grade.

Mission Starfish Haiti is located in Gonaives, Haiti. Gonaives is a city of 300,000 people and is located about 80 miles north of Port-au-Prince, the capital of Haiti. In the past few years, Gonaives has been affected by many disasters including hurricanes and cholera out-breaks. As many as 250,000 - 300,000 residents lack food, housing and education.

DO JUSTICE MAKE POACE Gelebrate PEACE WITH JUSTICE SUNDAY

PEACE WITH JUSTICE SUNDAY IS MAY 27

Each year, on the Sunday after Pentecost, The United Methodist Church observes Peace with Justice Sunday, one of our churchwide special offerings. We celebrate Peace with Justice Sunday because we recognize that true peace cannot be possible without the presence of justice.

The gifts collected on Peace with Justice Sunday are distributed between local and global Peace with Justice ministries. Fifty percent of the

offerings stay for use on projects within the local annual conference, while the other half goes toward Peace with Justice Grants administered by the General Board of Church and Society.

Those ministries that apply for grants must meet at least one of four main objectives: helping United Methodists understand and respond to violence and militarism, being involved in efforts to end conflict and violent aggression around the world, promoting policies locally and globally that restore communities in the midst of racial and ethnic injustice and inequality, and promoting systematic economic justice and self-development of people.


